The Call to Action in the Democratic Republic of Congo

The Call to Action on Protection against Gender-Based Violence in Emergencies is a global initiative launched in 2013 which calls for every humanitarian response, from the very first phase, to provide safe and comprehensive services for GBV survivors as well as to work on mitigate risks for GBV to occur. The Call to Action members are states, international organizations and non-governmental organizations. These different stakeholders committed themselves to a global Roadmap from 2016 to 2020. In 2018, the DRC's Ministry of Gender, Children and Family and DRC Humanitarian Country Team started the process of nationalizing this initiative in close collaboration with ECHO and UNFPA. A National Roadmap from 2018 to 2020 was launched in March 2019 in the capital. As the end of September 2019, 143 stakeholders from Kinshasa, Central Kasai, South Kivu, Tanganyika, Ituri and North Kivu working for the elimination of GBV in DRC are implicated. 68 of these stakeholders have taken formal engagements and are contributing in collective actions. A "Champion Committee" composed by representatives of the various categories of partners leads the initiative, ensuring collective accountability.

The National Roadmap for DRC is composed by 6 results and 17 collective actions. It is an example of "triple nexus" putting together development, peacebuilding and emergency actors. It has been able to gathered a very large audience at national and decentralize level, to increase information sharing and to revitalize engagement of national institutions and Congolese civil society. This is promising for the sustainability on the efforts towards the elimination of GBV.

Priority areas of the DRC's Call to Action Roadmap

The six results of the Roadmap and their priority actions for 2020

Stakeholders will to focus their collective efforts on the following six areas:

- Strengthening institutional policies and norms to combat GBV and promote gender equality;
- Strengthening GBV coordination through committed leadership and an effective and accountable inter-agency and inter-sectoral technical level;
- Improving the effectiveness of fighting against GBV in humanitarian action and post-emergency settings through needs assessment, analysis and planning processes;
- Promoting Resource mobilization from the first phase of the response;
- Ensuring the quality of GBV prevention and care interventions in humanitarian and development initiatives;
- Strengthening the technical capacity of stakeholders and leaders in all sectors of humanitarian aid and development assistance, in order to contribute effectively in reducing the risk of GBV.

All the stakeholders of the Call to Action in DRC agreed to achieve 6 results, identified 17 collective actions and commit with activities in each action.

In mid-august 2019 they decided to focus on few collective priority actions for greater impact and with the vision of the Champion Committee. This requested joint work in programming and coordination, the support to the finalization of the National GBV strategy and the GBV mainstreaming in other sector of the humanitarian response. As such, the Call to Action in DRC has now the following focus:

On the result n° 1 on strengthened policies and norms to reinforce accountability of all actors on GBV prevention and response, stakeholders are focusing on tree actions: (i) the support to the revision of the GBV National Comprehensive Strategy for the elimination of GBV (ii) the dissemination of policies, laws and practices to promote gender equality and eliminate GBV (iii) the support to the implementation of the National Action Plan of the DRC national Army (FARDC) against sexual violence.

• On the result n° 2 on inter-organisational and inter-sectoral coordination and on leadership, members to the Call to Action are prioritizing: (i) to Map women rights and women leaded organizations, (ii) to foster the engagement of all GBV actors providing services to survivors to national data collection system and (iii) to advocate for the operationalisation of a National Agency in charge of GBV prevention and response.

The Six results of the Roadmap and their priority actions for 2020 (cont.)

- On the result n° 3 on efficiency of the humanitarian response towards planning, analysis and assessments stakeholders decided to firstly (i) strengthen the approaches on nexus between stabilisation, humanitarian and development (ii) to promote integration of gender and GBV analysis in humanitarian and development planning.
- On the Result n° 4 on resource mobilization for a comprehensive response since the very start of an emergency till the sustainable development partners two actions are now prioritized: (i) on localization, to increase access of national and grassroots organizations to international funds and (ii) on engagement of the private sector.
- On result n° 5 on the availability of quality and specialized GBV services and GBV prevention partners prioritized (i) to undertake national capacity building on case management according to 2017 Inter-agency guidelines and (ii) to reinforce activities on prevention mobilizing all parts of society, including men and boys.
- On result n°6 on GBV risk reduction and mitigation throughout the various sector of the humanitarian response, Call to Action members decided to focus on the actions of (i) the diffusion of 2015 IASC Guidelines on GBV and those on Gender revised in 2017 and of (ii) the adoption of at least one indicator per cluster for GBV risk reduction in the HRP/HNO planning for 2020.
